Do's and Don'ts



Don't...throw medications away in trash containers even if mixed with kitty litter or coffee grounds!

Don't...flush down the toilet. Flushing and trashing is harmful to the environment!



Do...a yearly inventory of your medications and dispose of expired and unused drugs!

Do...Monitor, Secure, and Properly Dispose of Medications by utilizing public drug drop-off locations to rid your home of unused medications!

Need to Dispose of Medications?

When? Drop-off available at all locations 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

You Can Drop-off... Prescription drugs and over-the-counter medications.

You <u>Cannot</u> **Drop-off...** Illegal drugs, needles/ sharps, mercury thermometers, or any biohazardous materials.

How? Dispose of in original package or bottle, if possible, and cross out name and address on prescription bottles- do not cross off name of medications.

Why? Prescription drug abuse continues to rise for teens, young adults, and older adults. Medications left out or unattended are easily stolen for abuse. Moreover, disposal of medications in the trash or toilets endanger the water supply which endangers all of us.
